

## Open Letter to Eagle Scout Candidates

This letter is to assist you in successfully completing the requirements for the rank of Eagle Scout. The Pellissippi District Eagle Board of Review considers three questions when evaluating Eagle Scout Leadership Service Project workbooks. Those questions are:

Is the project a benefit to the community?

Is the project significant and challenging to the Eagle Scout candidate?

Does the project provide the opportunity for leadership of others?

Your peers have established a guideline by which your Eagle Scout Leadership Service Project Workbook will fulfill the Pellissippi District Eagle Board of Review's expectations.

Project Workbook should be typewritten.

Project Description should have a detailed project scope statement that would allow an objective reader to determine that the project was a benefit to the community.

Project Details should be filled out completely and thoroughly so that an objective reader to determine that the project was significant and challenging to the Eagle Scout candidate. This should include details regarding project condition prior to work, project financing, project work plan, project time schedule, safety issues, safety plan, to scale diagrams (draft and final), materials and equipment lists.

Carrying Out the Project should be filled out completely and thoroughly so that an objective reader to determine that you demonstrated sufficient leadership of other. This should include detailed work journal, project funding details, types of materials used with amounts, costs, and receipts.

Changes to Project to detail changes to the original plan and why those changes were made.

Before, during, and after photographs should be included and captioned. Photographs should be sufficient to give a clear example of the scope and effort of your project.

Eagle Scout candidates will also be required to complete the Eagle Scout Rank Application. The current Eagle Scout Rank application can be found at <http://www.nesa.org/>. You must use the current Eagle Scout Rank application. You will need to provide written references to satisfy requirement 2. Your Scoutmaster will provide you with details. You will also be required to provide a typewritten statement of your life's goals and ambition to satisfy requirement 6. Your peers generally write 3-5 paragraphs covering topics such as completing high school, college, trade school, military, career, family, and community involvement 10 years into the future.

Please remember that the official Boy Scout Uniform is the appropriate attire for a District Eagle Board of Review. Please refer to pages 32 and 33 of the current Boy Scout Handbook for details.
