The Knoxville News Sentinel's Mellon wins Golden Press Card

Ericka Mellon's feature, "Nursing on the Edge," is this year's winner of the Golden Press Card Award and a check for \$100 from ETSPJ. The story also won the Award of Excellence in the large circulation newspaper feature category.

The judges called it "thorough, thought provoking and well-written....An important piece because it addresses a disturbing problem/trend in an evenhanded manner." Mellon's story was about registered nurses in Knox County schools, and how in all but nine of 76 schools a nurse visits just one day a week to care for anything from a sore throat to a broken bone. The extensive feature found that the situation is not likely to change because of financial considerations.

Don Dare and Jason Hensley of WATE-TV won the Horace V. Wells, Jr. Community Service Award with "Health Scare."

This investigation exposed how sales agents for one of the nation's largest health care providers, Humana Inc., broke Medicare and Medicaid standards in their presentations to potential customers. As a result, the company ordered a halt

to sales in Tennessee while it implemented new guidelines to its sales force.

The judges from the Connecticut Pro Chapter said, "[The piece] does an important service for a most vulnerable segment of society – senior citizens."

The winners, selected from a record-setting number of entries, received plaques and certificates at the Golden Press Card Award Banquet May 12 at the University Club.

Featured speaker Dave Carlson, national president of the Society of Professional Journalists, told the more than 100 attendees that each should accept personal responsibility for improving the credibility of his or her news organization.

With the bottom-line mentality of publicly traded, corporate owners these days, Carlson said that individual journalists may feel powerless to influence the kinds of news practices that cause audiences to distrust the media. But he urged journalists to work one story at a time toward the highest ethical standards of journalism.

Carlson also promoted the work of the national Society of Professional Journalists, pointing out that the organization has been at the forefront of providing legal help for journalists and for fighting the ongoing battle for public access to government records and meetings.
