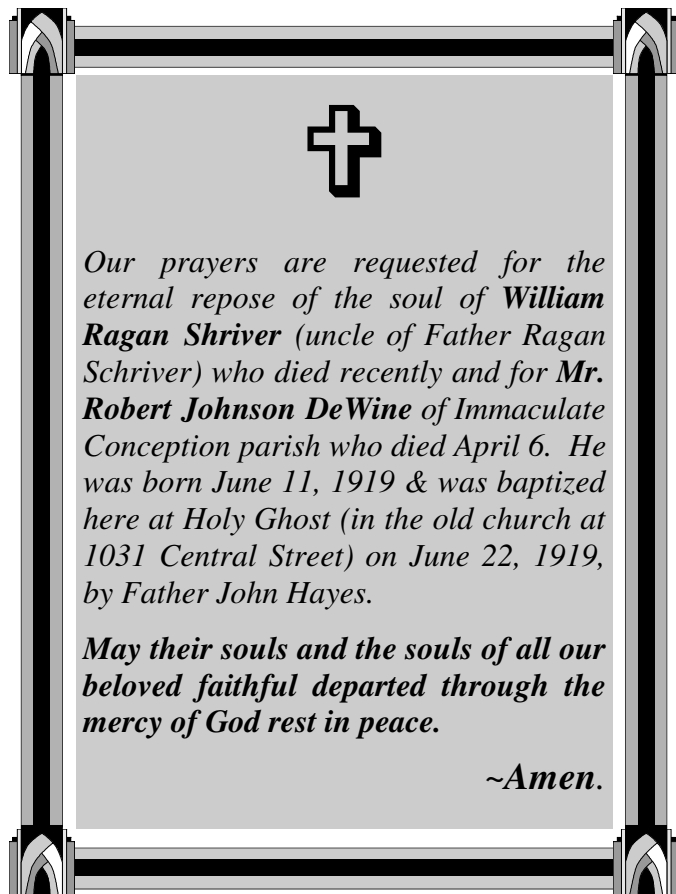

Priests' Space

Dear Members of the Holy Ghost Parish:

Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia! He has risen as He said! Alleluia! I knew without being much of a forecaster that Easter 2010 was going to be special and that it was going to be great and that (my first Easter here as a priest was in 1963) something absolutely marvelous would happen as it does every year. I want to single out two things (among many others) that made these holy, holy days so wonderful for me. The first was the great number of our parish altar servers who turned out for Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, the Easter Vigil, and the Easter Masses. Not only was the number sufficient to render appropriate solemnity to the celebrations but these young people know Catholic worship. Without exception each managed his or her privileged role in a reverent and faithful manner. Thanks, servers, and thanks to you, their parents, whose own faith and devotion promotes this sacred seasoning of the generations to come. Shortly after Easter next year I shall be inviting all of you to join in a Mass of Thanksgiving on the occasion of my fiftieth anniversary of ordination to the priesthood. Some of the servers already know that they have assignments for that 6 pm celebration on May 27, 2011. I hope that there will be at least 20 of them by then.

The other happy thing is your response to the special second collection for seminarian education which was lifted at all Easter Masses. The offerings ranged from one dollar to one thousand dollars for a total to date of \$4,404.00. It's not the total amount that impresses me so much (although I marvel at your generosity); it's your across the board participation in this special effort. You believe in the Church; you believe in the priesthood; you believe that the Lord Jesus set it up that we have a hierarchy of deacons, priests, and bishops to lead us to God. So, I want to thank you for your goodness in providing for the education of our future priests. I suspect that this special second collection will become a regular feature of our faith practice every Easter in years to come. Again we thank you and ask that you continue to pray for an increase in priestly and religious vocations. The special diocesan effort, CALLED BY NAME, that process that is designed to facilitate the invitation of men and women to consider priesthood and consecrated life will begin next weekend and homiletic reflections will focus on vocations.

As you know three of our friends from our mother parish, Immaculate Conception, received severe burns near the beginning of Easter Vigil celebration at IC on April 3. Each is recuperating and we pledge our

My dear Parishioners,

Peace! The first article of the *Apostle's Creed* is: I believe in God the Father almighty, creator of Heaven and Earth. There are forty "in brief" statements in *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* which treat this article of our saving faith. What follows is a reflection on article 416.

Part of our faith in 'God the Father Almighty Creator of Heaven and Earth, of all that is seen and unseen' includes the Fall or Original Sin. This is also called 'Adam's sin.' Part of this includes the good creation of our human race and the gift of free will which, in part, makes us image God.

Another part of the good creation of our human race includes the gift of 'original holiness.' This was the state we found ourselves in before Original Sin began our downward spiral away from God. We existed in God's image in many ways: our existence mirrored God's existence; our free will mirrored God's free will; our abilities to know and love mirrored God's all knowing and eternal love (1 John 4:8); so too the good state in which we were created included our being holy as the Lord our God is holy (Matthew 5:48; Ephesians 1:4; 1 Peter 1:15-16). Now, since the Fall, holiness is found in us only by God's grace in us. Grace won by Christ's death and resurrection which we celebrate annually between Good Friday and Easter, but in fact, we celebrate Christ's victory over sin (anti-holiness) each time the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is offered. The holiness which the Saints enjoy, is even greater than the 'original holiness' of 'the beginning' insofar as we are now not only creatures but heirs, co-heirs with Christ and citizens of Heaven (Ephesians 2:19; James 2:5).

Yet another part of God's good creation of the human race included the right relationship which existed between Heaven and Earth, God and us. This was forfeited by Adam's sin, Original Sin. Again, Christ's death and resurrection are the remedy. On the Cross justice and mercy have met (Psalms 4:1; 36:10; 40:10; 85:10; 89:14; 103:7; Proverbs 21:21; Hosea 2:19) so we are not restored to the 'original justice' of the garden but enjoy the benefits of the Divine Mercy made known in the Blood of Christ (1 Corinthians 10:16; Ephesians 2:13; Hebrews 9:14; 10:19; 13:20; 1 Peter 1:2, 18-19; 1 John 1:7; Revelation 1:5).

What Adam had received from God in Creation: being, life, free will original holiness and justice... was received not only for himself but in trust for all mankind who would descend from him in consequence of God's

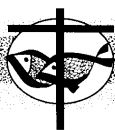
