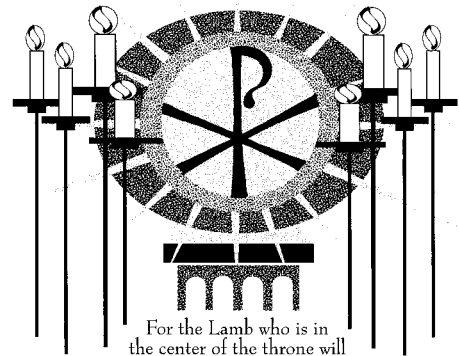
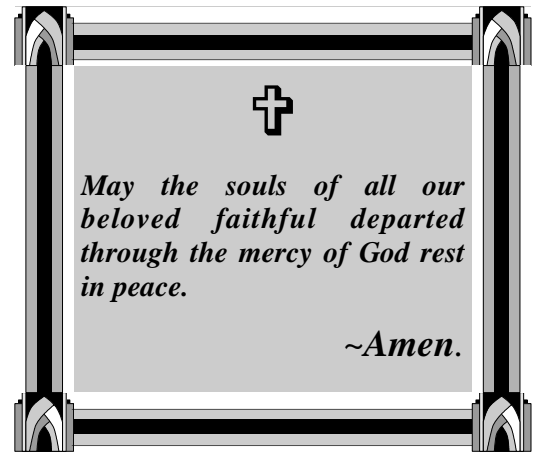

Priests' Space

Dear Members of Holy Ghost Parish Family:

Your Centenary Planning Committee has recommended that we have a special souvenir participation aid for the Sunday Masses on Pentecost this year (May 27). Please keep in mind that by the time Bishop Kurtz arrives for the 7 am Mass that day we shall have already celebrated two major Pentecost Masses: Saturday, the 26th at 4 pm at St. Joseph School— the Vigil Mass inaugurating our annual Parish Picnic and at 7 pm back here at the Church with our Hispanic brothers and sisters (who shame many of the rest of us in their ability to show their love of the Holy Spirit!).

That special program needs to go to the printer soon so we must have the names of all special ministers for those Pentecost Masses soon (ushers, greeters, singers, celebrants, readers, sacristans, altar servers, etc.) Those who chair those groups are asked to give the names of “your” ministers to Sara Clem (522-2205) or Sue Clancy (687-9396) at your very earliest convenience.

Now, not because the Bishop is coming but especially because the Bishop is coming do we need to perfect our church manners. The banging of the kneelers and the chewing of gum (park it in your pocket and NOT under the pew) **MUST STOP!** We should bless ourselves with blessed water as we enter the church, making the sign reverently and correctly. As we arrive at our pew we genuflect (right knee to the floor) toward the Lord in the tabernacle (no sign of the cross or bow is needed here—keep it beautiful and SIMPLE). Prepare your hymnal for the celebration by using the numbers posted on the hymnboard. The orans (outstretched hands) posture has not yet been adopted for anyone other than bishops and priests and holding hands (although traces of this unauthorized habit appear even here at Holy Ghost on occasion) has not yet become an approved gesture either.

Again, at Communion time please approach the Communion Station in an orderly manner, bow (from the neck; not from the waist) as you first gaze upon the Host. Says “Amen” as an act of Faith in response to the minister’s presentation of the Host to you and then receive our Lord on your tongue or in your hand as you prefer (if the hand: left palm extended for acceptance of the Host, using the right hand to take the Lord and place Him into your mouth.)

These may seem like trivial things to you and no single one of them can destroy a good worship experience. But once you start multiplying incorrect manners for worship, chaos begins to reign. This, of course, is very unfair not only to the celebrant but to the majority of our people who wish to worship the Catholic way (keeping the rules for the love of God and His Mystical Body, the Church).

So, again, I beg you to be as precise as you can in the reverent and holy manner with which you deport yourself here at beloved Holy Ghost. We have many visitors at weekend Masses over the year and by and large the good reputation our parish has for authentic worship is realized and appreciated.

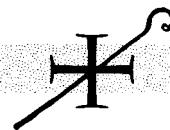
Please God that the shallow example of just a few won’t be a silent scream for “Yankee, go home.”
