## Priests' Space

Dear Friends in Holy Ghost Parish:

Again, I want to thank you for your patience and cooperation during the recent renovations. The last two big items of this Phase 1 are the placement of the lamp posts in the new Hinton Ave parking lot (try it, you'll like it) and the re-building of the Mary Shrine near the end of the "old" parking lot between the church buildings.

Next step? The remainder of your GiFT contributions (due by June 30, 2007) will be needed to remodel the church basement: new restrooms, better storage, at least one ancillary meeting room; and kitchen improvements. Your fidelity to the GiFT pledges will be greatly appreciated.

Our American bishops have authorized a NATIONAL (second) COLLECTION for next weekend, August 26-27. Please do what you can to alleviate the suffering and supply for the needs of our fellow Catholics just south of us along the gulf coast. I complete my words to you this week with the following information:

- In the Diocese of Biloxi, 428 of 433 church-owned properties were destroyed or seriously damaged.
  - In the Archdiocese of New Orleans, 200,000 homes were lost, including the rectories of priests and the homes of deacons who were attempting to minister to others while they themselves were losing everything.
  - In New Orleans, 60% of the population has not returned; 80% of the population in hard-hit St. Bernard's civil parish has not returned; almost no one has returned to Lower Plaquemines.
  - In some regions, people have had to move an average of three times, some as many as nine times, in attempting to re-establish their families and their livelihood.
  - Diocese of Biloxi reports \$70,000,000 worth of damage to buildings, but only half of that amount is covered by insurance. New Orleans reports \$52,000,000 estimated uninsured flood damage for buildings the Archdiocese is trying to reopen right now, and another \$70,000,000 for buildings whose reopening has to be delayed.
  - Rebuilding the Church and her structures is critically important now, as many civil jurisdictions declare that they are no longer able to house and care for persons displaced by the 2005 hurricanes, and will be unable to do so in the future.
- One year after the devastation of Katrina, this new collection is needed simply because last year's

### Diocesan Ministry Day August 26 8:00 am

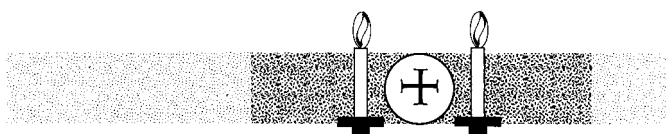
