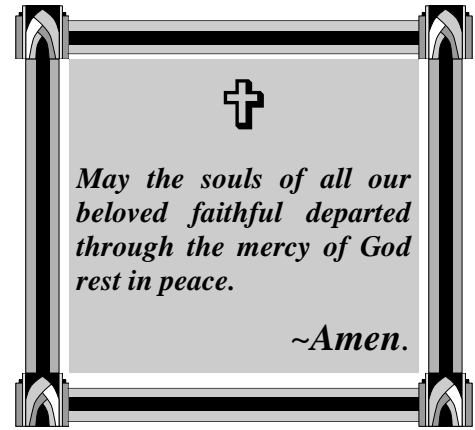

For all this we first thank God, and then to all of you who participated in any way since the centenary celebration was first announced some five years ago, we say thank you, thank you, thank you!

It would take more space than we have in the entire bulletin to even list the names of all who contributed and your special task(s) to make it all happen so beautifully and so well. The names of Sue Clancy, Carole Willard, Roseanne Wolf, Art Clancy III, Tom Wolf, Bob Montgomery, Jr., Pat Gang and Bishop Vann Johnston will go down as foundation stones on which we can confidentially rely as we forge ahead in our second century of Holy Ghost parish.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As a good cook or baker can tell you, you need not be terrified of the oven fire, but you must have a respectful fear of it. A misstep can leave your hand or your kitchen “well done”.

The mendicant (“begging”) founders of such orders as the Dominicans and the Franciscans had no terror of financial security, but they knew its dangers. Too much comfort in one's financial state reduces one's dependence upon God in the path to holiness and in the avoidance of sin, and then your life goes up in smoke at your death. More importantly, freedom from financial security allows a servant of God to depend upon God more freely, to serve God wherever he needs you. It is this sensitivity to God's will that prompts the Dominic's, Clare's and Francis's of the world to love the poor without reserve.

As the school year begins, let us pray that our children will learn well the lessons of the begging saints, especially the need for respectful fear of financial security. May the stories and companionship of these saints lead many of the youth of the parish into religious life.
