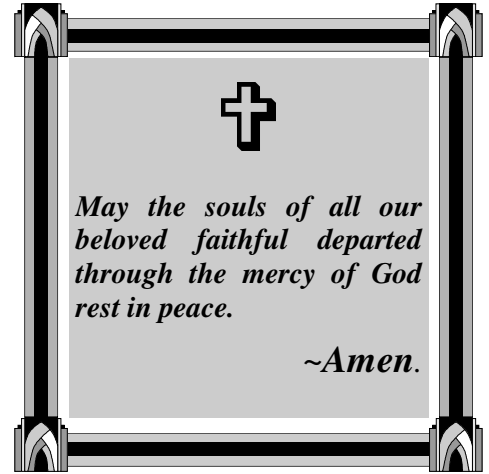

Priests' Space

Dear Members of Holy Ghost Parish:

Thank you, Thank you, Thank you! You braved the elements last Sunday to say goodbye to dear Father Patrick Resen and I'm sure he faces the challenges of his first pastorate at St. Catherine Laboure' at Copperhill, TN quite fortified with our prayers and best wishes for his every success there. As always, thanks to the men and women who not only prepared the yummy refreshments but for getting what looked to me like lots and lots of food to the extraordinary place where it was served. Back in the earlier days of the 20th century it was not uncommon to see tenting a'plenty. Today it's usually only at revivals held by our non-Catholic brothers and sisters that tents are used EXCEPT at Holy Ghost where we have had occasion quite recently to celebrate campaigns, anniversaries, and now good-bye and hello receptions for our priests. (A stranger in town might not realize that we have the most beautiful interior of any Church in town in our permanent sanctuary. I anxiously await with you the refurbished basement (crypt; undercroft) whose reconstruction is proceeding on schedule.)

Today we shall celebrate our semi-annual Anointing of the Sick and Elderly at 4 pm. The Latin Mass (Mass of Pope John XXIII - the Extraordinary form) will be at 1:30 pm today and all Sundays in the future. I believe that these seven liturgies (six holy Masses and the Anointing) will set a new record even for Holy Ghost for the number of public worship opportunities this venerable parish is able to offer you. Think about this as you say your prayers of thanksgiving tonight. Holy Ghost has its "bells and smells", yes, but this is far from the entire picture of parish life here before you.

I had hoped to provide workshops for special ministers of Holy Communion, ushers and greeters by now but I'll use Father Resen's transfer as an excuse for some delay. The altar server training went well and we thank not only the servers involved but also their parents for participating.

Father Orr did not arrive until Friday, July 31. His assignment began August 1. So he did not have time to prepare a column for you. In lieu of that we offer you some lines from an interesting pamphlet from Our Sunday Visitor, Written by Lorene Hanley Duquin and entitled "Living Through Change In Your Parish". Of course the most significant changes which occur in any parish are changes in personnel, especially priest personnel. We have selected some lines from the pamphlet (Inventory No. P1020) for your consideration: Centuries of Change

Some Catholics like to think the Church is unchangeable; this is true, when it comes to the essence of what we believe. But the Church has changed in other ways over the centuries:

- Jesus himself was an agent of change: he challenged the practices of the religious leaders, healed the sick, welcomed sinners, and established a new Covenant.

- The lives of the Apostles changed radically as they struggled to understand what it meant to be a follower of Jesus. On Pentecost, they were changed from frightened men into fearless missionaries.

- The early Christians changed from a small Jewish sect into a faith community that welcomed Gentiles. They faced constant change in their attempt to spread the Gospel in times of persecution.

- After Constantine made Christianity the official religion of the Empire, change became widespread: churches were built; sacred writing were gathered into what we call the Bible; new liturgies and music were introduced and new religious communities formed.

- Throughout the centuries, saints introduced change with new styles of prayer, penance, and service to the poor.

- The Protestant Reformation prompted Church leaders to look at abuses in the Church, leading to the changes made at the Council of Trent. Changes continued to be made with the installation of popes & the convening of synods & councils.

- Our own ancestors faced change when they left their homelands and built new faith communities in this country.

- Some Catholics recall the uncertainty after the Second Vatican Council (1959-1962), when there were dramatic changes in the way we celebrated Mass and in the buildings where we gathered to worship.

One thing is clear, however: while change has continued throughout the centuries, our Catholic faith is rooted in the one, immutable, unchangeable Eucharistic Lord—he who transcends history, and thus transcends all change.
