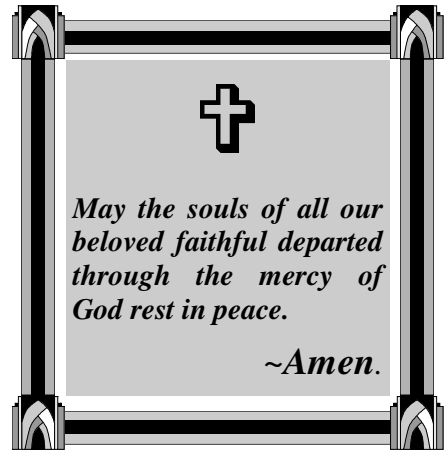

Priests' Space

Dear Members of Holy Ghost Parish:

I can't tell you how great it is to have our two young priests here at Holy Ghost even though Father David will return to Rome for his final year of graduate study on September 28. After that only Father John Orr and I will share Holy Ghost's demanding schedule of holy Masses, baptisms, confessions, anointings, and weddings (Confirmations and ordinations are left to a higher power - and, thankfully he, Bishop Stika, continues to recover from his recent diabetes related serious illness - please keep up your prayers for his long-lasting recovery).

The five weeks of gospel interest in the Holy Eucharist prompts a response on our part: deeper faith in the Real Presence and more and more reverential celebrations of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. We still await the new Roman Missal but in the meantime we can continue to implement the improvements we all know about already:

- In receiving Holy Communion, make a bow of the head (only) as soon as you see the consecrated Host in the hand of the priest or other minister.

- After you hear the words, "The Body of Christ", respond with a distinctly pronounced "Amen" (no other response is appropriate).

- Receive the Sacred Host on your tongue or in your outstretched (level) hands - the choice is yours, not the minister's.

- No sign of the cross is made during this ritual procedure - reverent, faith-filled simplicity is the mind of the Church for all this.

I have received word that the Royal Beauty Supply people have accepted the offer made by our Ladies of Charity to purchase the very fine building and grounds at 120 West Baxter Avenue (the building is immediately across the alley which runs south to north behind Holy Ghost Church). As part of this purchase our parish will buy the lots just west of the Hinton Avenue parking lot which was developed and landscaped a couple of years ago as well as a lot on Wray Street north of the alley that deadends into the rear of the Holy Ghost Church building (you might have noticed some large trucks using that lot for some time - a quite dangerous situation because of such limited space). Our Parish Pastoral Council's Building and Grounds Commission and Council #645 of the Knights of Columbus have committed to keeping all these outside grounds in park-like conditions. This anticipates the real possibility of having no on-street

My dear Parishioners,

Peace! The first article of the *Apostle's Creed* is: I believe in God the Father almighty, creator of Heaven and Earth. There are forty "in brief" statements in *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* which treat this article of our saving faith. What follows is a reflection on article 231.

"The God of our Faith is revealed as the One who is; He is made known as 'rich in grace and fidelity' (Exodus 34:6). Even His being is Truth and Love (see 1 John 4:8; Saint John 14:6; 18:37)."

These three passages of Sacred Scripture, cited by the *Catechism* all refer to God's very being, existence. They presuppose a fourth passage, namely Exodus 3:14: "I Am Who Am." These are all key passages of Holy Writ.

The way that we exist is complex. I exist as the son of my parents the brother to my siblings, associate to our Pastor, Priest of our Diocese, so tall, so heavy... some of these however are less a 'part' of me. If I suffered a terrible accident which severed my legs from the rest of me, I would no longer be 'so tall.' If I eat more cookies (or less) the scale will read differently, but it will still be my weight...

The way that the One Only God exists does not allow for any compartmentalization. All at the same time God is: 1.) Rich in Grace; 2.) Rich in Fidelity; 3) Truth; 4) Love. These four (4) could be called "Divine attributes." There are others. God's very being is truth, He reveals the truth to us, of old through the Prophets and in the fullness of time in Jesus Christ, Truth Incarnate. There are many whom we love, our families and friends, our nation (patriotism is love for our country). God's very being, however, is love. In us, grace, fidelity, truth and love may (or may not) all co-exist, side by side. Some are all present all at once, others only on some days and in us only during our lifetimes, (mine began with my conception in 1968). God is without beginning or end and these various attributes (our language) are all one in the One Only God whom we adore and who loves us.

Let us pledge in our hearts that we will do all in our power to reflect more and more in our lives the image of God in us by seeking and receiving God's grace in the Sacraments, by being faithful in all we do, by only saying and doing the truth in love.
