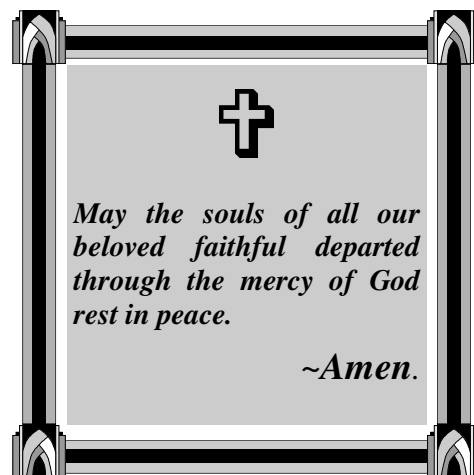

Priests' Space

Dear Members of Holy Ghost Parish:

Words could never adequately express our gratitude to one and all, but especially to Father John Orr, our new associate pastor, for all the nice things that happened here over the days since this new month of August has begun.

The farewell reception for Father Resen went very well in spite of the inconvenience of being under the tent in the rain. So, too, last Sunday morning's welcome reception of Father Orr was a veritable baptism - water, water, water! The afternoon receptions were a bit dryer (weather-wise). We had thirty people to receive the Sacrament of the Sick at 4:00 (including the feeble pastor). Special thanks to Lorraine McWilliams, Gertrude Sharpe, Carolyn Toal, Sue Clancy and so many, many others, a veritable army of food bearers, all at some inconvenience because of the circumstances, who bore the heat and moisture of the day quite well. Thank you, thank you, thank you.

The relocation of the Mass in Latin, Extraordinary Form, seems to be a good move. It will keep Father Orr and Holy Ghost people from needing to travel and the others come from all around so this is a fine location for them. Since our Church was designed before 1965, it's very well suited to celebrations in the "old" (now called the Mass of Blessed John XXIII) Rite.

This five week series of liturgies of the Word which focuses so pointedly on the Eucharist, the Bread of Life, would have us consider, along with many other aspects of the Mass, our behavior and the protocol for this most important part of our lives. So, once again:

- please come on time for Mass. Arriving a few minutes early gives us time to prepare our hymnal as a participation aid and to settle in an atmosphere for responsible worship. The sign of the Cross is more appropriately made as one takes blessed (holy) water at the stoups at each door (a reminder of baptism) than when genuflecting toward the tabernacle as one enters his/her pew. It is made as the presider begins the celebration with it, although the only word the people say is "Amen". The sign of the Cross is not a part of the penitential rite but is properly made three times (once each on the forehead, lips, and breast) in acknowledgement of the proclamation of the Gospel. The only other time that the people make the sign is at the blessing at the end of Mass. Please note: (and this can cause confusion): the sign of the Cross is required several times during the Mass in the Extraordinary Form. Pope Benedict XVI has prescribed that we do not pick

Peace! Thanks you so much for your very warm welcome last weekend. I have had the privilege of various assignments over the years, but do not recall a more effusive outpouring of genuine Christian hospitality as the one I received from you. Thank you too for all of the prayers which you have (and will continue) to offer for me that like our Pastor, Monsignor Mankel, I might be for you a Priest after the Heart of Jesus. What great mentors I have been given in the various Pastors I have served under: Father Chris Michelson (at All Saints), Father John Dowling (at Saint John Neumann) and now in 2009, what a blessing to begin service with Monsignor Mankel. The phrase "Priest's Priest" comes to my mind when I think of him. In having this little forum each week I thought I would use it to a systematic catechetical purpose. I will focus on the *In Brief* statements of the Catechism of the Catholic Church, which can take twenty (20) hours to go over orally. I will see you in Church!
