Priests' Space

Dear Members of Holy Ghost Parish:

And what a dedication it was...! I know that every member of Holy Ghost parish who knew Father John Dowling as he served here and at Knoxville Catholic High School from 1986-97 must be rejoicing and congratulating him on the completion of the beautiful Romanesque church at St. John Neumann parish, Farragut. It is a magnificent arena for the worship of God. The acoustical problems which such an edifice might offer are very well solved by a full house of worshippers. Father John, may your nave ever be filled to running over.

One of the disappointments which Father Resen has experienced here at Holy Ghost is the across-the-board inconsistency of the service rendered by the altar servers and the ushers. At some Masses everything is so splendid that one could not expect anything better. At others, unfortunately, with no server or even worse, one who comes late, and the absent ushers, again, even worse, ushers who arrive after Mass has begun, the entire celebration is bereft of the integrity the Mass needs to be pleasing to the Lord our God. Elsewhere in the bulletin you will see a box about altar servers. I would have re-established the Knights of the Altar, so dear to Father Follman's heart but the national group is for men only at the moment. Our solution will probably be to have our own Knights & Ladies of the Altar.

For ushers, we shall have workshops beginning soon after the basement remodeling has been completed. Meanwhile, since we could use 25-30 more regular ushers (actually it would be great to have an usher at each side door, four for the front vestibule and one for the choir loft at the 8:30 & 10 am morning Masses and for the 6 pm Sunday Mass) why not think about becoming one of our pillar ushers? Our Hispanic community as well as our Latin Mass group will have their own ushers so the five English masses are those for which our regular ushers are responsible. Be thinking about volunteering to be a regular usher (same Mass time every week or perhaps you would like to be the regular usher on days of precept that do not occur on Sunday). Give your names (men or women) to head usher on days usher Frank Higgitt, to Greg McGinnis, head Knights of Columbus usher, or to me. Holy Ghost already has the best choirs, the best sacristans, readers, and finest greeters. We might as well be known for the finest ushers and altar servers in the diocese too.

Dear Fellow Members of Holy Ghost:

Three of the California missions are replicas: San Rafael (a parish church), Santa Cruz (a parish church; the rest of the property is a state park), and Soledad (the chapel was restored via private societies; there are four Masses a year). San Francisco Solano and La Purisima are state parks. Santa Clara is the chapel for Santa Clara University. The rest are active parishes, four under the Franciscans and the rest diocesan. San Diego, San Carlos Borromeo (Carmel), San Francisco de Asis, and San Juan Capistrano have been designated basilicas by the Holy See.

Traveling the mission trail makes a wonderful vacation. The trail itself is more or less US 101, the Camino Real, and therefore almost all are easy to get to. Each mission is different and provides its own history, some small and some large, some active and some not active parishes, some in the heart of major cities and some in very rural lands. Each is beautiful in its own way.

The scale of Santa Barbara cannot be overlooked and San Carlos Borromeo in Carmel is a must, but my favorite mission is probably San Juan Bautista in the little town of the same name, about 30 miles from Monterey (northeast) and about 85 miles south-southeast of Oakland. The mission is the largest now of all the missions with a wonderful large church with a triple nave, a complete and large cloister, and a nice museum. It still sits on the plaza which, together with the buildings on two sides of it, constitute a state historical park (the fourth side is open and overlooks a small valley, a rift of the San Andreas fault). You will probably recognize the mission, the plaza, the old hotel, and the livery stable from the movie *Vertigo*, the classic Alfred Hitchcock work of 1958. (But note that the church does not have a bell tower, so central to the plot, so Hitchcock had to superimpose one on the mission he wanted to use. Yes, it's my favorite but if you catch me on another day I might say San Jose...or San Miguel Archangel...or La Purisima Conception....

Every California child in public schools studies the missions in the fourth grade. They provide a wonderful learning experience of the Church in America and are a proper study for all American Catholics.

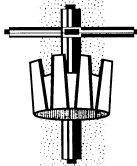
