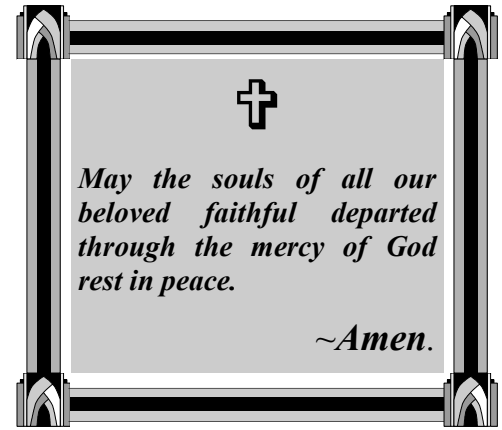

Priests' Space

Dear Members of Holy Ghost Parish:

Again, many thanks for the great St. Joseph School Fall Festival. The figures aren't all in yet but I know that your hard work and generous cooperation yielded a tidy sum for the on-going operation of our parish school.

Ground breaking will occur soon as shovels turn over the soil at St. Joseph School Cedar Lane, and construction begins on the gymnasium-auditorium. Please, God, that the building will be completed for use at next year's St. Joseph School's Fall Festival. (Keep those cards and letters and dollars coming in, folks.) The growth of the church in North Knox County is a wonderful gift from God. Let us show our gratitude in tangible ways.

I mentioned at some of the Masses last Sunday how very important the offertory collection is. Several of you commented that you had been somewhat unaware of the offertory collection's huge importance in the operation of a parish.

Well, now you know. Please make every effort to increase your generous contributions to the offertory collection from now on. When we realize that such offertory giving is an act of public worship, we know even more how very important an ingredient this moment of giving is in the economy of our salvation.

Manners in Church - when to bow - when to genuflect. I offer the following article from a recent issue of Pastoral Liturgy, September/October 2008:

Q: When should one genuflect and when should one bow during Mass?

A: Prior to the Second Vatican Council, when the tabernacle in most churches was in the center of the altar at which Mass was celebrated, all genuflected when approaching, leaving, or passing the altar and tabernacle (except if carrying the cross or candles). A bow was made only when serving a private Mass at a side altar. After the Second Vatican Council, the tabernacle was separated from the altar and a distinction was made in liturgical books between reverence during Mass toward the altar, a symbol of Christ (General Instruction of the Roman Missal, #298), and reverence outside of Mass toward the Blessed Sacrament reserved in the tabernacle.

If the tabernacle with the Blessed Sacrament is in a separate chapel, the rules are simple. At those cases, one bows toward the altar when reaching the sanctuary at the beginning of Mass and before leaving at the end of Mass (cf. 2002 GIRM, 122, 169). One should also bow toward the altar whenever moving past it (Ceremonial of bishops, #72). The deacon who carries the Book of the Gospels (since it is a symbol of Christ) omits the sign of reverence to the altar, goes to the altar to place the Book of the Gospels upon it, and, after the celebrant arrives at the altar, joins the celebrant in kissing the altar (GIRM, 173).

Confusion can arise when the tabernacle is in the sanctuary. In this case, the Blessed Sacrament is acknowledged with a genuflection when those in the entrance procession reach the sanctuary at the beginning of Mass, and right before they leave the sanctuary at the end of Mass (GIRM, 274). Those carrying the cross or candles bow their heads instead of genuflecting (ibid.).

GIRM, 74, also states, that if a tabernacle is in the sanctuary, the ministers in the sanctuary do not genuflect, GIRM, 315, states "it is more in keeping the meaning of the sign that the tabernacle in which the Most Holy Eucharistic is reserved not be on an altar on which Mass is celebrated." The reasoning for this principle is found in the 1967 Instruction on the Eucharistic Mystery, footnoted in the GIRM, This instruction speaks of the gradual revealing of the modes of Christ's presence: first in the faithful gathered in Christ's name, then in the word proclaimed, the person of the minister, and finally in a unique way in the Eucharistic (#55). It notes that "consequently, because of the sign, it is more in keeping with the nature of the celebration that the eucharistic presence of Christ, which is the fruit of the consecration and should be seen as such, should not be on the altar from the very beginning of Mass through the reservation of the sacred species in the tabernacle."

The new prohibition against genuflecting before the tabernacle during Mass is, in a sense, an extension of the 1967 principle calling for separating the tabernacle from the altar. If the "eucharistic presence of Christ" is the "fruit of the consecration and should be seen as such," reverencing the reserved sacrament during Mass can detract from the focus on the celebration.

The 1967 instruction recalls that "the primary and original purpose of reserving the sacred species in Church outside Mass is the administration of viaticum [for the sick and the dying]" (#49). This is repeated in the 1973 section of the Roman Ritual on Holy Communion and Worship of the Eucharistic Outside of Mass, #5. That paragraph states that the giving of communion and the adoration of Christ present in the sacrament are secondary ends. If we realize that the tabernacle is primarily for use outside Mass, and the altar during Mass and for other liturgical services, then the prescribed references make sense. In both cases, reverence is given to Christ. During Mass, reverence is given toward the altar as a symbol of Christ, upon which Christ becomes specially present in the eucharistic elements.

Outside of Mass, reverence is also given toward the tabernacle where the eucharistic presence remains, especially for the sake of the sick and dying.

I hope this helps.

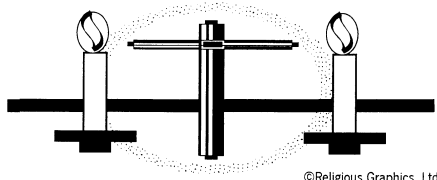
