Priests' Space

Dear Members of Holy Ghost Parish:

Here we are - October! October and May are months of special devotion to Mary, the Mother of Jesus, the Mother of God, and our Mother also. In addition to recommending any part of or all of the Holy Rosary as a daily way to perfection, you might also pray the Litany of Loretto, the Memorare of St. Bernard, and the Salve Regina.

October is the special month in our diocese of Knoxville when we emphasize STEWARDSHIP—of time—talent—and money. TIME: if everybody in Holy Ghost parish would come to Sunday Mass we'd have full houses of worship many times over; TALLENT: God has blessed our people with the wherewithall to do great things. These abilities come from God Himself. 'Tis a pity indeed we fail to develop and use our talents. And, then there's MONEY without which a parish like ours can not long exist. Really, folks, it's as simple as that. We need to tithe. We need to give 10% of what God gives us back to Him - OFF THE TOP. Since before Vatican Council II (1962-65) the Catholic bishops of Tennessee have urged us to follow the Scripture mandate to tithe. They have further specified that 1/2 of our tithe (5% of our income) should be contributed to our parish; that 2/5 of our tithe (2% of our income) be given to the diocese for the broadened works of church; and that 3/5 (3%) of our income be set aside every single week for the additional claims to our stewardship that pop up everywhere. Here at Holy Ghost I urge you to contribute from that last 3% (if your income is \$500.00/week that'd be \$30.00 split between the Church basement renovation fund - you may still call it GiFT - and the fine arts/sports/gymnasium being built at St. Joseph School. But the bottom line, as always, is that week-in, week-out contribution to the OFFERTORY collection at MASS - the number one need of any parish and the number one need you and I have within ourselves to get right and stay right with the Almighty God. He cared to send His Very Best, Jesus, the Christ, to us; we need to care enough to give just ten percent back. So, if I make \$400/week, then I'll be truly tithing if I contribute at least twenty dollars to my parish; eight dollars to the diocese (x 4 or 5 if I give to that fund only once/month); and split twelve dollars each and every week among the deserving second collections, especially the basement renovation fund and the gym at St. Joseph's School.

Again we remind you that the annual St. Joseph parish festival will be at St. Albert the Great campus (7200 Brickey Lane, Powell) this year. We invite you to

My dear Parishioners,

Peace! The first article of the *Apostle's Creed* is: I believe in God the Father almighty, creator of Heaven and Earth. There are forty "in brief" statements in *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* which treat this article of our saving faith. What follows is a reflection on article 265.

"By the grace of Baptism 'in the Name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit', we are called to partake in the life of the Blessed Trinity, down here, in the obscurity of the Faith, and after death, in eternal light."

Grace is the power of God at work in us. We receive a great outpouring of God's grace in all of the Sacraments beginning with Holy Baptism. Sometimes grace has been equated with the Third Person of the Holy Trinity, the Holy Spirit (Holy Ghost).

Christian Baptism is administered by invoking the One Only God's Name: the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. That the singular word 'Name' is used and not 'names' reminds us of the unicity of God, that God is One. That Father, Son and Spirit are used reminds us of the Trinity of God, that God is Three.

The One Only, Triune God is a communion of Persons. We enter into communion with the eternal communion of the Holy Trinity by our Trinitarian Baptism. This is a sharing in the very life of God, whose temples we become by the gift of grace given in the saving waters as the Holy Name is invoked.

What we see is water. What we hear are words. What we know by Faith is that we are born anew into God's family which is Mother Church. When the *Catechism* mentions the 'obscurity of the Faith' it is not a reference to an attempt to prevent the Faith from being known. The whole reason Christ our Lord came was to reveal to us God and ourselves made in the image of God; to bring us into the eternal communion of Persons which is the Trinity. But that God exists as a Trinity of Persons is knowable only by means of supernatural Faith. A gift given and reinforced in Holy Baptism, renewed each time we approach the altar with reverence and devotion, each time we well confess our sins with heart felt sorrow.

A happy consequence of graced living in communion with the all Holy God and the holy People of God in the here and now is not only the temporal light of Faith but also the reward of 'eternal light' which is the *Catechism's* way of saying Heaven.

Let us redouble our efforts at being faithful and appreciative of God's self-gift in Holy Baptism and joyfully bring others to those same saving waters by which God leads us to Heaven.
