Priests' Space

Dear Members of Holy Ghost Parish:

If it were not such a very serious matter I'd be amused at the confusion floating about between a flu shot for the regular flu and a flu shot for swine flu. The medicine for swine flu shots will not come to this area for at least several more weeks but the medicine for the "regular" flu which we receive every year is already available.

There is still some confusion also about just what a Latin Mass is. This was not much of an issue until recently (because the Mass of Pope St. Pius V was very limited in its use), when the permission given by Pope Benedict XVI to use "more broadly" the Mass formulae which was the only one between 1570 and 1969 in our Western Church has now been extended to a broader "family". Presently there are 2 forms of Masses in Latin: the "extraordinary form" (Missal of Pope Jn XXIII) which was the standard Mass in the West for 399 years, and the "ordinary form" which has been the standard Mass ever since the Second Vatican Council's improvements in our public worship (Mass facing the people, broader selections from the Scriptures, nine Eucharistic Prayers, etc.). You and I ordinarily celebrate this Mass in the vernacular (around here in English or Spanish) but it is perfectly ok to celebrate it in Latin. Strangely, we do not have an official translation of the extraordinary form in the vernacular, although there are good translations printed side by side the official Latin in our old Latin-English missals. So what? Well, midst the confusion I feel that you and I ought to know which Mass formulae we use here at Holy Ghost. So: 7:00 pm Saturday Mass in Spanish is official translation of the Novus Ordo (the ordinary form); 7 am, 8:30 am, 10 am, 11:30 am, and 6 pm Sunday Masses are in English (again, an official vernacular translation of the ordinary form). The 1:30 pm Sunday Mass in Latin is the extraordinary form (Missal of John XXIII but linked to the missal of Pope St. Pius V way back in 1570). Each is a valid and licit celebration. Each fulfills the obligation to assist at Mass on days of precept. Well, you'll say, if we already have all this, what is the continuing discussion about a new Roman Missal whose official English translation is due soon - surely within this decade or very early in the next? It will be a better translation from Latin into English of the Novus Ordo (ordinary form) of the holy sacrifice of the Mass. The translation of the Scriptures will continue to be the Revised Version of the New American Bible but with the psalms being the Grail Psalter (easier to sing).

My dear Parishioners,

Peace! The first article of the *Apostle's Creed* is: I believe in God the Father almighty, creator of Heaven and Earth. There are forty "in brief" statements in *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* which treat this article of our saving faith. What follows is a reflection on article 262.

A technical term for God who became like us in all things but sin is 'Incarnation.' This has nothing to do with the carnation flower, but everything to do with the blossoming of our salvation. The Spanish word for meat or flesh is 'carne.' When the Eternal Son of the Eternal Father took on our human nature to save us He received His flesh, His body, from the Virgin Mary by the power of the Holy Spirit.

We are adopted sons and daughters of God the Father through Jesus Christ His Eternal Son made man, incarnate, in time. This teaching is specific to Christianity. Our divine adoption occurs in our Baptism (of which we will have future articles).

There has been a heresy (false teaching) which claimed that at one or another point during His life on Earth that Jesus was adopted by the Father. This heresy is called adoptionism. Our Faith is that there never was a time and never will be a time when the Father was not the Father and the Son was not the Son. While Christ our Lord was conceived and born in time, by the power of the Holy Spirit of the Virgin Mary His person is an eternal Divine Person. The *Creed* and the *Catechism* treat this aspect in greater detail in later articles so we will treat it further latter. Here we are focusing on the equality of the Father and the Son. Neither is more or less God. Neither is more or less eternal. There are two great feasts of the Incarnation: Christmas (25 December) and nine (9) months earlier the Annunciation (25 March). The one celebrates Christ's birth, the other His conception (distinct from Mary's Immaculate Conception, when she was conceived without Original Sin in preparation for her being the Mother of God).

Incarnation is not the only technical term in this article. The other key term here is 'consubstantial' so often translated as 'one-in-being.' The prefix 'con' means 'with.' The 'sub' part, like an underwater craft, means 'under.' The Greek word *ousia*, meaning 'being' was taken up by the Fathers of the Council of Nicea (325AD) to stress the 'sameness of being' shared by the Father and the Son. The Father and the Son are distinct or different in their Person but the same in their Being. The *Creed* reinforces here that God is the origin and end of all that is, all being comes from and leads back to Him.

By God's grace at work in us may we be one with the Lord in whose image we are made and one with each other.
