Priests' Space

Dear Members of the Holy Ghost Parish:

The completion date for our Church basement renovation is scheduled for the first week in November. Won't it be great to have our nice facilities available again?

How to pay for all these improvements? Because your track record of paying debts off ever since 1908 is so fine, the Bishop authorized a loan (repaid over 15 years) to cover everything but the tile flooring in the approach corridors and in the main hall of the basement. The concrete will be sealed so that it will be clean and safe. We presume to pay off these loans without resorting to special second collections. This can be done IF and only IF our Sunday offertory giving increases by some \$2,000.00 - \$3,000.00 per week. All of this will be laid out in the materials you will be receiving soon regarding the annual stewardship appeal for 2010. Yes, we still must make pledges - to the parish for offertory (that's the main one!); to the diocese (very important too); and for continuing church renovation (we have to have this one too - but you can already see how much bang for your buck you've been getting with this one over the past several years). The GiFT envelopes will remain (monthly) as well as the weekly envelope for the capital campaign to build the gym and attendant facilities at St. Joseph School. So the Hand of Christ will be there, waiting every day for you to cross His Palm. It's not really a bad deal. He asks only for one-tenth back from all He has given us. Again I must remind everybody of the necessity of contributing to the offertory collection. I'd recommend that that claim at least one half of all you contribute to the Church. The remainder of your tithing can be used for all the other collections on our list - and some of you have tithing obligations even beyond the parish and diocese. So as stewardship time of year comes to us, let's pull in our belts even more than ever. There is just too much at stake to do otherwise. The membership at Immaculate Conception as well as that at St. Albert the Great is already rising to the occasion/opportunity that is genuine church support. Once we have committed ourselves to the responsibilities and obligations of real Church support, our entire lives change for the better. Why? Simply because God will NOT be outdone in generosity! So again, HAVE AT IT.

My dear Parishioners,

Peace! The first article of the *Apostle's Creed* is: I believe in God the Father almighty, creator of Heaven and Earth. There are forty "in brief" statements in *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* which treat this article of our saving faith. What follows is a reflection on article 263.

While the first article of *Creed* focuses on the eternal Father, there is implied reference to the Son and Holy Spirit (Ghost) all the same, our Triune God. The Eternal Father has sent the Eternal Son into the World for our salvation, this is Jesus' mission. The Eternal Father and the Eternal Son together send the Spirit who lets us cry out 'Abba, Father' and 'Jesus is Lord.' The last third of *Creed* treats the Holy Spirit specifically and in detail. Here the *Catechism* is stressing the unicity of the Trinity, oneness in being and in action or mission.

It was not the Eternal Father who was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit or born of the Virgin Mary or was Crucified or died or was buried or rose; this was the Son, Jesus, who had been sent by the Father to do all of this saving work. Similarly, it was not the Father who descended upon the Lord in the Jordan or upon the Apostles in the upper room fifty days after Easter but rather the Holy Spirit in the form of a dove or appearing as tongues of flame. Both the Son and the Spirit sent in mission, as are we, adopted children of God in holy Baptism.

The *Catechism* reminds us that we should not only adore and glorify God the Holy Spirit on Pentecost, the Solemnity of the Holy Spirit, but always. For we live and move and have our being in God, Father, Son and Spirit. When we begin and end our worship, with the Sign of the Cross this can be a moment of adoration and glorification not only of the Father and Son but Spirit too. Likewise when we pray the *Gloria* or *Glory be* prayers. Of course we adore and glorify the Holy Spirit when meditating on the Third Glorious Mystery of the Holy Rosary praying for a new outpouring of the Spirit on the Church, the world, ourselves, asking God's help that we might love the Lord all the more.

In Holy Baptism we have been made temples of the Holy Spirit, one with the Father and the Son. We have likewise been given a share in the mission given to the Son and the Spirit by the Father, namely that God be glorified and adored here and now no less than in the hereafter, not only by our words but by the holiness of our lives.
