Traffic Calming



The next step in the traffic calming process has begun. Traffic monitoring devices were installed on Cecil, Kanterbury, Chantilly, Fountain Park, and North Park in early October.

The entire traffic calming process is lengthy and we are still in the early stages. After the traffic patterns are analyzed, a recommendation will be made by the city. There will be a neighborhood meeting to review the recommendation and to voice concerns.

All costs associated with this traffic calming initiative is **paid by the NHAA and the city**. There are no fees assessed of residents.

Trashy News

Did you know that there is a City Ordinance that states that up to four 32 gallon of garbage cans will be collected from each house-hold?

Garbage cans must be set out no earlier than 6:00 p.m. on the day before or no later than 7:00 a.m. on the day of collection. They must be retrieved no later than 9:00 p.m. on collection day."

Bulky waste is collected on the same schedule as household garbage. It is described as "household items that cannot be put in garbage cans because of size, shape, or weight." Such as a stove, bundled and tied carpet, an old bicycle, or tires. Up to 5 self-contained or bundled items are allowed per week. Bulky waste is subject to the same set out times described for household waste.

But just after this show, we will be racking up the leaves. Just a reminder, that **leaves and branches are to be kept separate because they are picked up by different crews and trucks.** It helps with the pick up of the leaves if they are placed just at the curb or median, rather than in the middle, because the vacuum device that collects leaves is limited in its reach.
