Property Update

Robert Pless

On Wednesday, October 31, 2007, Marvin, Marg and myself met with the Oak Ridge City Manager Jim O'Connor and the city attorney Ken Krushenski, along with the representatives of Girl's, Inc. During this meeting, we were given a copy of the Quitclaim Deed showing the city has acquired the armory property from the state. We were told that the city will now draw up a contract stating that the City of Oak Ridge reserves the first right of refusal to repurchase the property if for any reason either organization should be forced to sell the property in the future. Once this contract is complete, we will need to have our attorney look it over and the city will take this before city council on November 17, 2007 for their approval. After the contract is signed by ORKC and Girl's, Inc., it will go back before council on December 19, 2007 for final approval. The city will then set a closing date on the property within a few days of the final approval of council.

Mr. O'Connor then informed us that we can now have total access to the property and begin making any changes, repairs, etc that we want to make. This means that we can once again begin our training classes in January. We will also be able to begin the clean up on our property. We have changed the locks and the property has been mowed, thanks to Marvin and Robert. There is still a lot of clean up on both the property and the buildings before we can get them ready to move into.

For the first time in ORKC history, we will be property owners before Christmas. With a lot of work and dedication from our members, we will never again be without a place to train and play with our best friends.

We were recently informed that the property will need to include a 30 or 50 foot wide strip on the East side of the armory property to assure that we will have a proper right of way to our property. What this means is that our property deed will now include a 30 or 50 foot wide section that spans from the Oak Ridge Turnpike back to our property. This will assure ORKC that we will forever have access to our property if for some reason the Girl's, Inc. property is sold. It will also increase the purchase price by approximately \$400.00. This is a small price to pay to make certain that we will never be land locked and have to invest much more to obtain a right away at a later time.

November 19: Tonight the city council voted unanimously to transfer the armory property to Girl's Inc. and ORKC. The mayor addressed the resolution stating that both groups had worked very hard and had waited patiently throughout a long process but he stated that this property could not be going to two more deserving organizations. The motion for approval was made by councilman Willie Goulden and the second was councilwoman Ellen Smith. Some of you may recall that councilman Goulden came to our training class at the armory with the mayor, city manager and the city clerk. The contract between both groups will go before the council on December 19, 2007 and a final vote will then be taken. Hopefully closing on the property will take place shortly thereafter.

The ORKC board recently voted to forego the Christmas Dinner this year and hold a work session on December 8 at the property site. We would like to invite all of our club members and associates to come and join us and tour the property, give us your ideas on how we can improve the property and help begin the process of cleaning and transforming the property into our new home.

Oak Ridge Kennel Club Monthly Meeting Minutes

October 4, 2007

There were 17 people present when President Donna Burchi called our meeting to order at 7:00; the Secretary read the minutes of the September meeting. David Miller made a motion that the minutes be accepted as read, with a second by Robert Pless. The vote was unanimous to accept the minutes as presented. Treasurer Pat Vogel was not present, but reported to President Burchi that the Treasurer's report was sent to be included in the Woofers.

Training: Training Director Ione Smith noted that rally classes are now being held in Knoxville, and we hope to continue ORKC training classes in January in the Armory building until we can clean up our own facility.

Show: AKC correspondence closed out last years show and contained applications for 2008, and all was given to Show Chair Burchi. There was discussion about having an obedience/rally "match" in the evening. Catalog advertising prices will be increased. Onofrio letter notified us that AKC has increased fees for conformation/obedience/rally entries. Joyce Cardwell made a motion that our entry fees increase to cover this charge, seconded by Robert Pless. The vote by Board members present was unanimous to pass along the AKC increase to exhibitors. Publicity is needed prior to the show, and Kathy Kear will be asked to submit press releases again. There was discussion about the advisability of putting an ad in the AKC events, but nothing was decided.

By Laws: There will be discussion about the bylaws at the October meeting and a vote on each item will be taken at the November meeting. There was also further discussion about the 501(c) 3 and determination that, even if we don't pursue the status immediately, the financial records need to be put in order for future use. Majority of meeting attendees do not want to rescind the motion to pursue the tax exempt status.

Tracking: Nothing new

Agility: Nothing new

Search: Robert Pless reported that the City is waiting for the original deed to come back. There was discussion about how the property will be paid for (President Burchi will contact Treasurer Vogel to advise her of the vote at the last meeting authorizing her to write a check immediately from the BB&T checking account) quickly when arrangements are worked out.

Correspondence

Outgoing: Secretary Joyce Cardwell read a copy of the letter informing TVKC that we had no interest in holding our show with theirs in the immediate future. Also sent out to AKC was the list/addresses of the new ORKC Board and officers elected in June 2007.

Old Business: There was a brief discussion about how to raise funds (silent auction, after-show-hours bake sale) and how to save money (donations of personal time instead of reimbursement) in the future for use with our new facility. This topic will be discussed further

New Business: The Christmas party was discussed. Joyce Cardwell brought dates that the Wildcat Den was available, but the only Saturday (preferred) was December 1 when ORKC has a tracking seminar. The Millers felt that they could reserve the union hall for an appropriate date. Joyce Cardwell made a motion, seconded by Marg Ellis, that the Millers be authorized to commit for a date if a suitable one is available.

Adjournment: The meeting was adjourned at 8:45 p.m.

From My Perspective....

It's Monday November 12 and I'm writing this while sitting INSIDE the East building of ORKC's new home. Marv Ellis is back on his tractor finishing up the last of the bush-hogging & mowing (three times around the property, both inside and outside fence.) As I came in I was impressed with how much better the whole place looks. Grass & weeds off the buildings, floors swept, lockers emptied & junk hauled off, etc. But I was equally impressed with all the work that lies ahead!

This year, instead of a Christmas Party, ORKC is planning a Work/Tour/Work/Party/Work Day on Saturday, December 8, from 10:00am till about 4:00. You'll notice the key word in the event is "WORK". There are lots of jobs, large and small (see list below). There is a job for everyone!

(At this time, we have electricity but not water. Bolded items can be done before the water is turned on)

- **Pulling/cutting weeds out of chain link fence. (Bring clippers).**
- **Rake grass & weeds. (Bring weed eaters & rakes).**
- **Move lockers, desks, cabinets, bookcases from various buildings to the 20 X 60 steel building. Decide what equipment ORKC wants to keep & what is available for members to have, & what will be scrapped.**
- Sweep bathrooms (if fixtures are out).
- **Plumb bathrooms & make one handicap accessible.**
- Plumb kitchen & ready social lounge area in East building.
- **Clean up the big Armory Building (if they have electricity).** *The "Girls Inc." is graciously planning on renting our former training site to us for a few months while we get our Motor Pool property functional.*
- **Move our mats, mat carts, jumps & other equipment from storage (\$100/month) into the Armory.**
- **Continue tearing down walls in the West building, pulling nails from salvageable lumber. Haul off sheetrock & debris.**
- **Repair broken windows.**
- Check heating & air.
- Pest control
- Power wash and spray paint inside walls & floors of East & West buildings.
- Insulate Steel building

Possible additions to both the East & West buildings need to be discussed. Also ring sizes & arrangement. We should set up some other weekend and weekday work dates. There's lots to talk & think about! Hope to see you on December 8th!

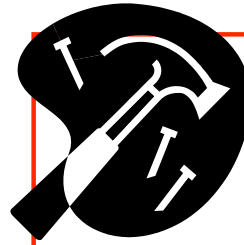
