### Climate Change and Nature: Real Risks, Real Solutions

There's been a lot of talk about the details of Climate Change. People are wondering how high will sea levels rise, or how certain we are that human activities cause climate change -- 90 % ?--- 99 % ? But the real question we should be debating is: WHAT ARE WE GOING TO DO ABOUT IT?

Bill Stanley, an OAK RIDGE HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATE, is the science lead for the Nature Conservancy's Climate Change Team. A forest scientist, with degrees from U of Va. and Yale, he has worked on climate change at the Conservancy for over eight years, including research and studies on forests in the U.S., Belize, Brazil, Peru and Bolivia. He has also worked extensively on climate change policy, drafting proposed climate-change legislation and engaging in policy discussions internationally.
