



MESSAGE FROM SCOTT MATHOT

GOLF TOURNAMENT FUNDRAISING SPONSORSHIP RESULTS TO DATE ARE ENCOURAGING!

The sponsorship drive this year was kicked off on June 30th with a request letter to former sponsors (money given) and supporters (gifts given). Last year we were able to collect over \$10,000 in sponsorship money. My initial goal for this year was to raise at least \$12,000 on sponsorships. As you read on, you will see that we might do even better.



The great news is that to date we have four Corporate Sponsors: McDonalds (Joe Burger), Regal Entertainment (Ray Scott's neighbor Greg Dunn), Tate & Lyle Americas, and Wal-Mart. These sponsors account for \$4,000 toward that \$12,000 goal! Last year we had only three corporate sponsors. We have also received good news that the Brunswick Boating Group will return to as an Event Sponsor (\$500) after several tough years. We also have commitments from several important "Eagle-level" Sponsors (\$300): LeConte Wealth Management (Bill Crowder), Rouse Construction (Terry Boyes), Swofford Financial and Brogan Financial (Bob Kryter), Village Realty and one of the doctors at Fort Loudoun Medical Center (Bob Treece/Paul Thornton). As of July 26th this brings the total received or committed to \$9,450. Success has been the result of personal connections and the development of key contacts.

Further, we have started a "Miners" Group to develop new candidate accounts. For example, the Miners are looking at AT&T, BellSouth, Pfizer Distribution, & Pilot Corp. among others. If we can get something going here, even if it begins somewhat small, we'll have something to build on in the years to come.

I'm proud of all your work because this is a great accomplishment, coming much earlier than in the past. In addition, if we get commitments from the balance of last year's accounts, we can achieve an additional \$4,000 and far exceed our initial goal for sponsorship this year. However, there are still many accounts that donated last year that we have yet to close. ***We need these accounts!!!*** Lets go get them.

It's fun seeing a plan comes together! Help make it our best year ever!

ANNUAL BACK-TO-SCHOOL CLOTHES AND SUPPLIES EVENT KICKS OFF THE SCHOOL YEAR

On Thursday, July 21st members of the Kiwanis Club of Tellico Village distributed 40 gift cards, each worth \$100, to deserving children in the Loudon County area. The distribution of Wal-Mart prepaid gift cards is an annual project that the Kiwanis club implements each summer just before the school year begins. This year the club was able to increase the amount of funds and the number of children who benefited by 20% due to the generosity of our supporters.

The Wal-Mart store in Lenoir City graciously provided space and refreshments for all the participants. Wal-Mart's Tammy Lane and Dara Gross hosted the event.

Bob noted that this is one of the many programs that the local Kiwanis Club pursues to provide help to the youth of the community. The Kiwanis Club motto is "Serving the Children of the World". The funds for this type program come from the generous support of the local community for the many fundraisers that our club sponsors.
