



LT. GOVERNOR SUBMITS GOALS

Bob Wendt, our Division Lieutenant Governor from Madisonville, addressed the club, briefly, this month. His main point was his list of goals for his tenure in office. He urged all the club to make good efforts to meet those goals. The are:

1. To increase member attendance at club meetings by 20%.
2. Each club to have a club brochure by March 1, 2008.
3. Each club to have a orientation program for new members in place by March 1,2008.
4. Each club to have a campaign to wear the "K" pin at all meetings.
5. Each member to send out at least one letter of invitation to prospective new members by March 1, 2008.
6. To have at least 2 clubs in Div.4 participating in the Key Leader program by March 1, 2008.
7. 50% of the clubs in Div.4 to be awarded the Distinguished Club Award in the year 2007-08.

Approximately 60 Kiwanis members, 15 Kiwanis wives and friends and 14 Loudon High School Key Club members were needed to feed more than 950 diners on Saturday, November 17. Proceeds were near to \$7,500, with a net income of more than \$5,500.



These results are due to the tremendous support our club membership gave to making this the biggest and best pancake breakfast so far.

Of course, we must also recognize that Tellico Village residents are also ready to support a good cause. This seems especially so when a meal as good as pancakes, sausage and quiche are thrown into the mix. Our event is one that might even give more than it receives. Thanks to Donna Covert and her quiche crew, the meal is a delicious bargain.



This time around, we enlisted the assistance of three local banks to help make tickets more convenient to purchase. First National Bank (Charles Chadwell), BB&T (Linda Smith) and United Community Bank (Les Blair) in Tellico Village sold more than \$800 worth of tickets. It is likely that they reached some new customers who might not have otherwise purchased tickets. The branches of BB&T and United Community Bank in Lenoir City and Loudon also had tickets available, but sold only two. We are grateful to all these banks for their generous help.



Can the breakfast be done bigger and better? We know that we were pushing the capacity limits of the Community Church for throughput of diners. We know we can improve the flow somewhat. We believe there might be a solution to the location of the grills for cooking the pancakes. The bottleneck at the juice/fruit/yogurt serving table can be resolved.
