KIWANIS CLUB OF TELLICO VILLAGE INITIATES FUND RAISER FOR THE EAST TENNESSEE CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL

The Kiwanis Club held a photo contest in May to identify the "CUTEST BABY FACE" in the Knoxville area. All funds generated will go to the East Tennessee Children's Hospital. This "children's hospital" is one of the key organizations that the Kiwanis Club of Tellico Village supports. Ray Scott, president elect and co-chairman, has been the prime liaison with the Children's Hospital for several years. He has led the club's efforts to support the hospital financially and with volunteer activity. He initiated the program this year with help from Chuck Hitch, co-chairman, and several other Kiwanis Club members.

The contest was held at the West Town Mall beginning on Saturday, May 15th with nominations by parents, family and friends. The contest was open to children 6 years and younger. Pictures were taken of each nominee and posted at the mall. Voting took place through Sunday, May 23, 2010. "Images by Design" provided the photographic services.

Over 70 contestants were entered. The contestants were split into two age groups, 1-3 and 4-6. The winners were chosen by "total" votes. There were seven prizes overall; the top 3 vote recipients at each level and one grand prize winner. The grand prize winner took home gift certificates for over \$700.00.

Each vote cost a donation of \$.01, or \$1.00 for 100 votes. By a rough estimate over one million votes were cast during the week after nomination and photographs. The winners were selected and announced on Saturday, May 23. Bob Yarborough, from our local CBS news station, WVLT, graciously donated his services as MC.

The program generated over \$11,000 for The Children's Hospital, a fabulous result for this "first time" event. The Kiwanis Club of Tellico Village is proud to be associated with as supporter of the East Tenn. Children's Hospital, and plans to continue this "CUTEST BABY FACE CONTEST" every year.

East Tennessee Children's Hospital was founded in 1937 by a group of physicians and community leaders with a mission to treat the medical needs of all children regardless of the child's race, religion, or parents' ability to pay. Children's Hospital is a private, independent, not-for-profit pediatric center and the only state-certified Comprehensive Regional Pediatric facility in East Tennessee. Children's Hospital treats children from birth to 21 years of age, and in 2007-2008, more than 150,000 patients visits were made to the hospital. Children's Hospital continues its mission today through the generous financial support of the community.
